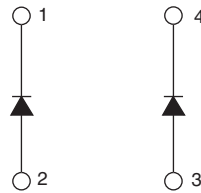

DESCRIPTION

The UFB60FA40P insulated modules integrate two state of the art Vishay HPP ultrafast recovery rectifiers in the compact, industry standard SOT-227 package. The planar structure of the diodes, and the platinum doping life time control, provide a ultrasoft recovery current shape, together with the best overall performance, ruggedness and reliability characteristics.

These devices are thus intended for high frequency applications in which the switching energy is designed not to be predominant portion of the total energy, such as in the output rectification stage of welding machines, SMPS, dc-to-dc converters. Their extremely optimized stored charge and low recovery current reduce both over dissipation in the switching elements (and snubbers) and EMI/RFI.

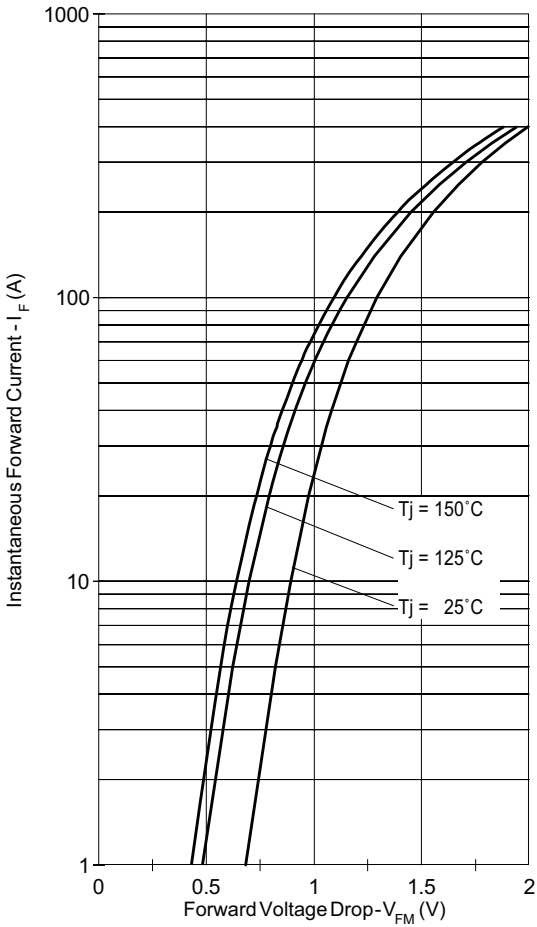


Fig. 1 - Maximum Forward Voltage Drop Characteristics (Per Diode)

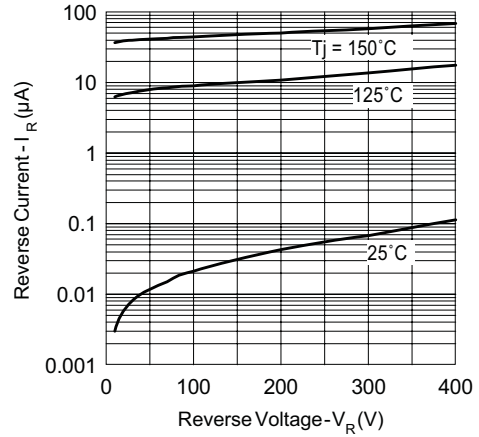


Fig. 2 - Typical Values of Reverse Current vs. Reverse Voltage

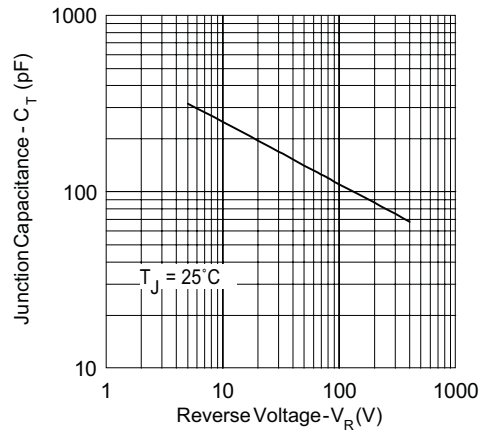


Fig. 3 - Typical Junction Capacitance vs. Reverse Voltage

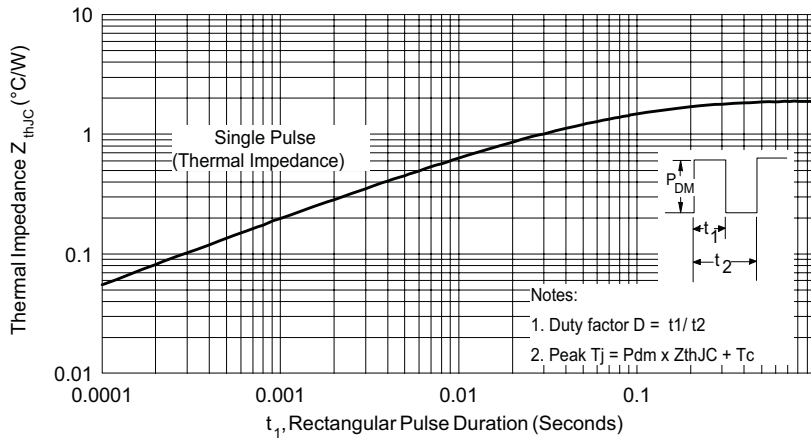


Fig. 4 - Maximum Thermal Impedance Z_{thJC} Characteristics (Per Diode)

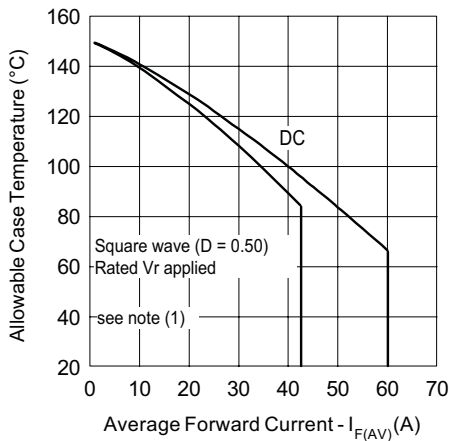


Fig. 5 - Maximum Allowable Case Temperature vs. Average Forward Current (Per Leg)

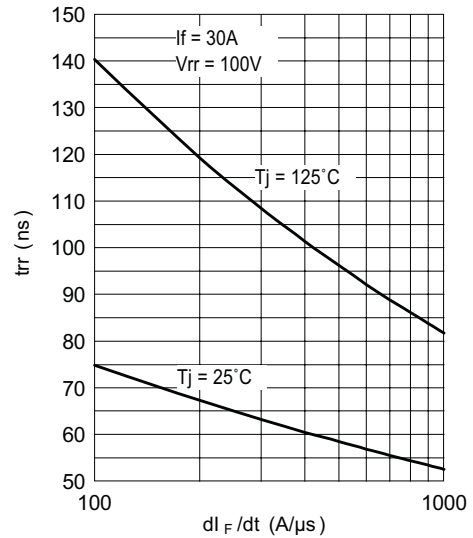


Fig. 7 - Typical Reverse Recovery Time vs. dI_F/dt

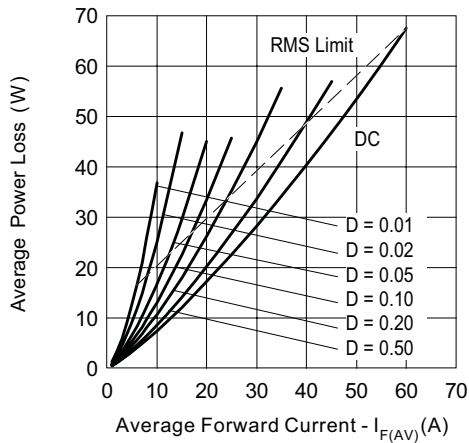


Fig. 6 - Forward Power Loss Characteristics (Per Leg)

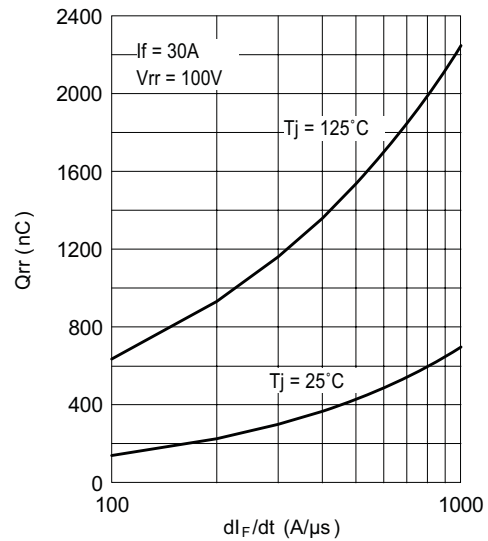


Fig. 8 - Typical Stored Charge vs. dI_F/dt

Note

 P_d = Forward power loss = $I_{F(AV)} \times V_{FM}$ at $(I_{F(AV)}/D)$ (see fig. 6);
 $P_{d_{REV}}$ = Inverse power loss = $V_{R1} \times I_R (1 - D)$; I_R at V_{R1} = Rated V_R

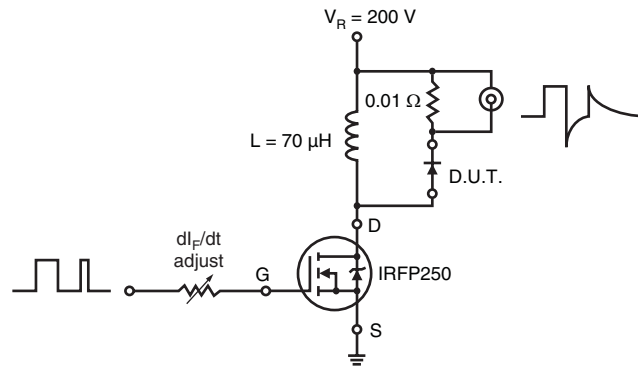
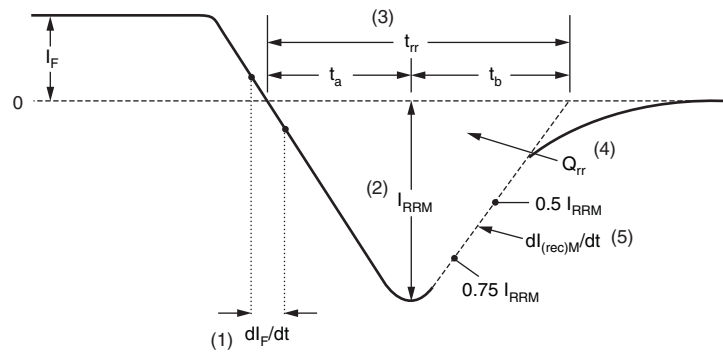


Fig. 9 - Reverse Recovery Parameter Test Circuit

(2) I_{RRM} - peak reverse recovery current

(3) t_{rr} - reverse recovery time measured from zero crossing point of negative going I_F to point where a line passing through $0.75 I_{RRM}$ and $0.50 I_{RRM}$ extrapolated to zero current.

(4) Q_{rr} - area under curve defined by t_{rr} and I_{RRM}

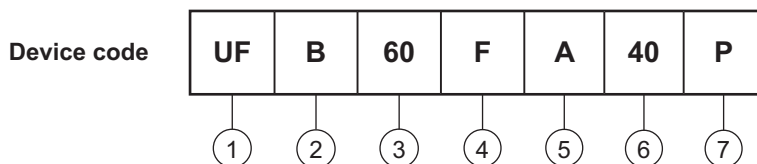
$$Q_{rr} = \frac{t_{rr} \times I_{RRM}}{2}$$

(5) $di_{(rec)M}/dt$ - peak rate of change of current during t_b portion of t_{rr}
