
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

Fig.1 Forward current vs. Forward Voltage




Fig.2 Relative Intensity vs. Forward Current




Fig.3 Forward Voltage vs. Temperature




Fig.4 Relative Intensity vs. Temperature





Fig.5 Relative Intensity vs. Wavelength

Fig.1 Forward current vs. Forward Voltage




Fig.2 Relative Intensity vs. Forward Current




Fig.3 Forward Voltage vs. Temperature




Fig.4 Relative Intensity vs. Temperature





Fig.5 Relative Intensity vs. Wavelength

Fig.1 Forward current vs. Forward Voltage




Fig.2 Relative Intensity vs. Forward Current




Fig.3 Forward Voltage vs. Temperature




Fig.4 Relative Intensity vs. Temperature





Fig.5 Relative Intensity vs. Wavelength
