The Powerline range of high power modules includes half bridge, chopper, dual, single and bi-directional switch configurations covering voltages from 600V to 3300V and currents up to 3600A.

The DIM200MBS12-A000 is a bi-directional 1200V, n channel enhancement mode, insulated gate bipolar transistor (IGBT) module. The IGBT has a wide reverse bias safe operating area (RBSOA) plus full $10\mu s$ short circuit withstand.

The module incorporates an electrically isolated base plate and low inductance construction enabling circuit designers to optimise circuit layouts and utilise grounded heat sinks for safety.



Fig. 1 Bi-directional switch circuit diagram




Fig. 2 Electrical connections - (not to scale)



Fig. 3 Typical output characteristics






Fig. 5 Typical switching energy vs collector current





Fig. 6 Typical switching energy vs gate resistance









Fig. 7 Diode typical forward characteristics

Fig. 8 Reverse bias safe operating area










Fig. 10 Transient thermal impedance










Fig. 12 Matrix converter phase current vs switching frequency




Fig. 13 Module outline
