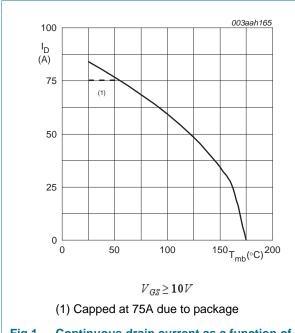


Fig 1. Continuous drain current as a function of mounting base temperature

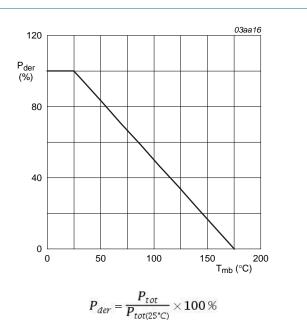
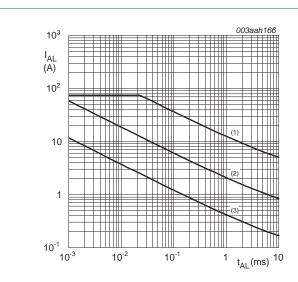
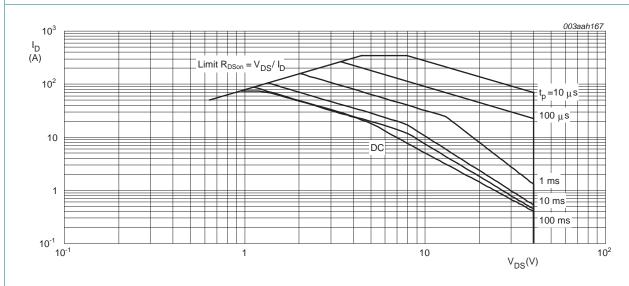


Fig 2. Normalized total power dissipation as a function of mounting base temperature

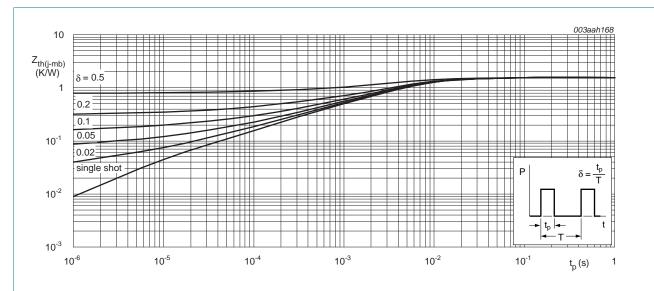


Fig 5. Transient thermal impedance from junction to mounting base as a function of pulse duration

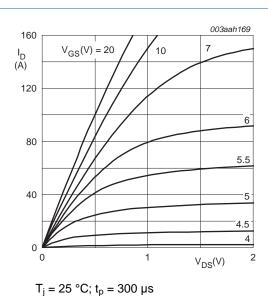


Fig 6. Output characteristics; drain current as a function of drain-source voltage; typical values

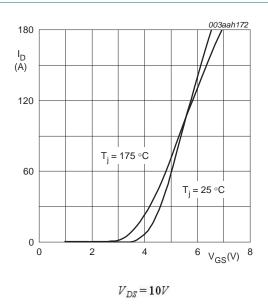
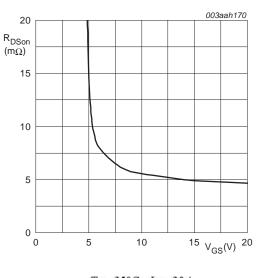
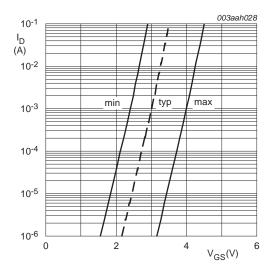


Fig 8. Transfer characteristics; drain current as a function of gate-source voltage; typical values

Fig 9. Sub-threshold drain current as a function of gate-source voltage

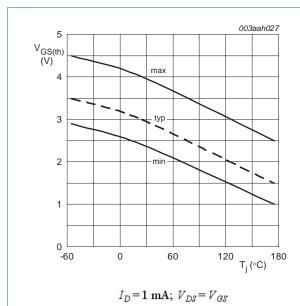


Fig 10. Gate-source threshold voltage as a function of junction temperature

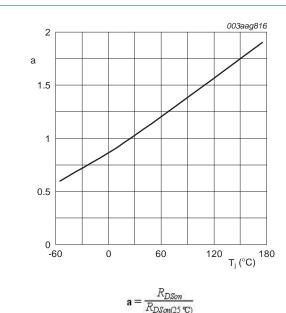


Fig 12. Normalized drain-source on-state resistance factor as a function of junction temperature

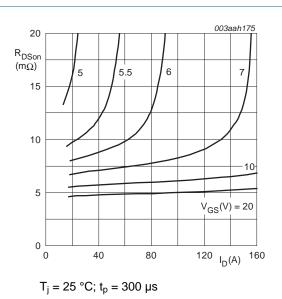


Fig 11. Drain-source on-state resistance as a function of drain current; typical values

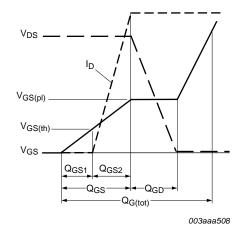


Fig 13. Gate charge waveform definitions

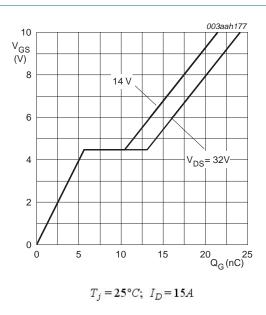
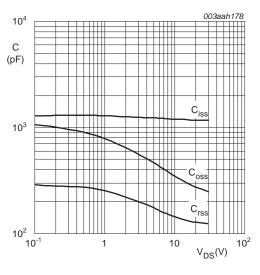
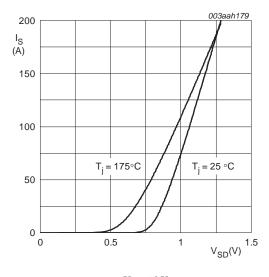


Fig 14. Transient thermal impedance from junction to mounting base as a function of pulse duration

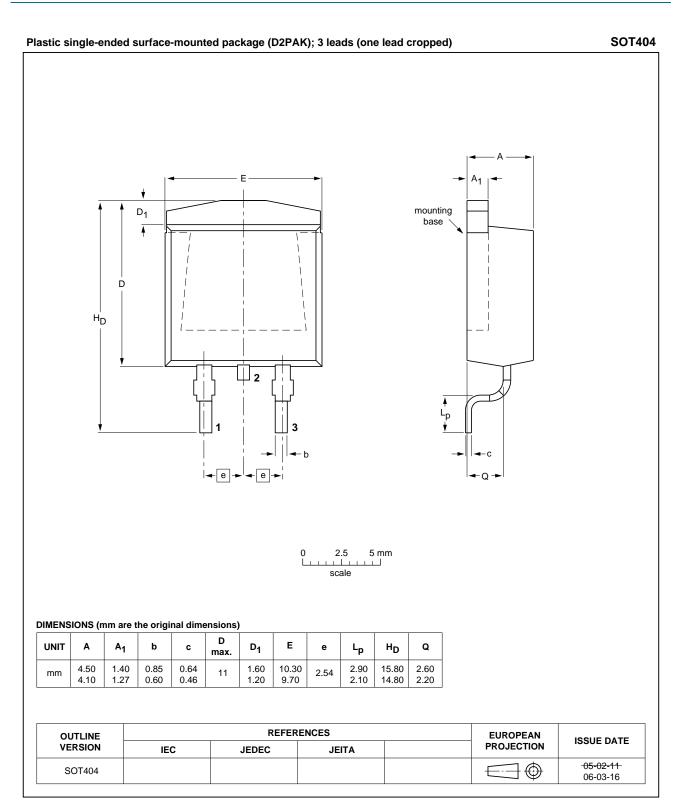


Fig 17. D2PAK (SOT404)
